Saturday, March 10, 10-11:00 am

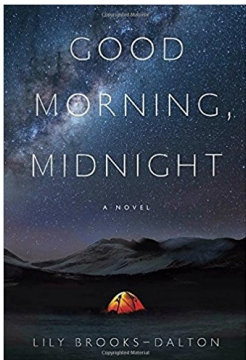

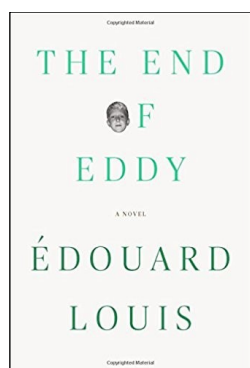
